

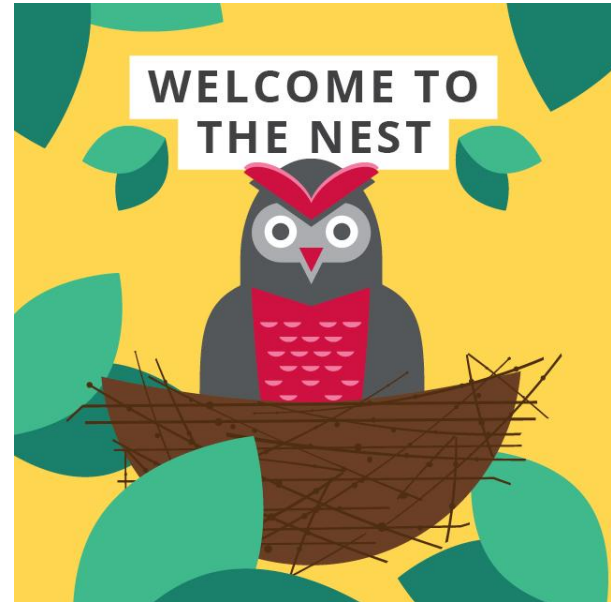

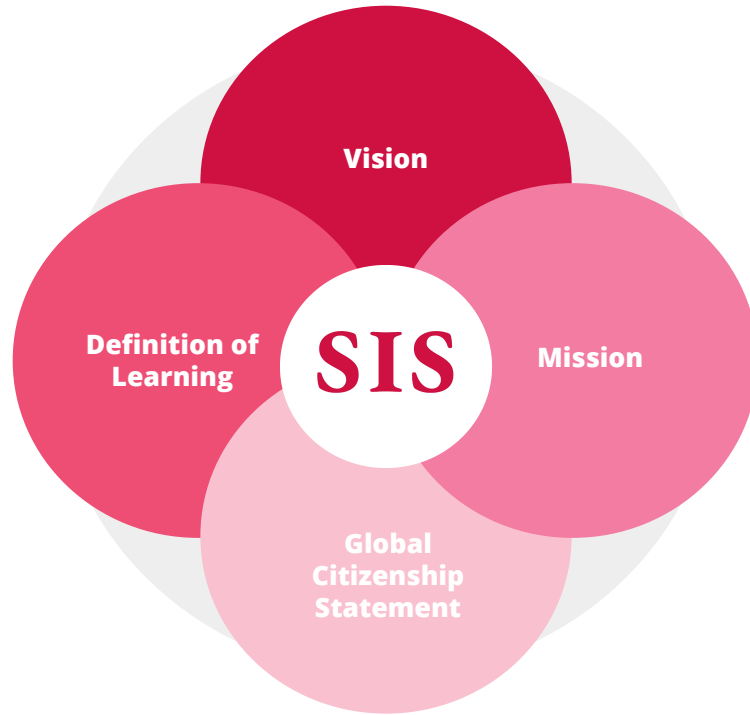

***prepared** to embrace these learning challenges in their current and future life, and accept responsibility for their own actions.*

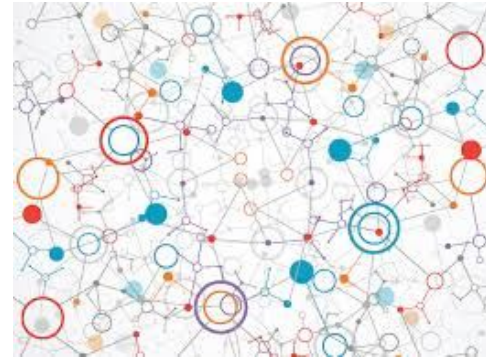
Our Global Citizenship Statement

World average: 29.9 points



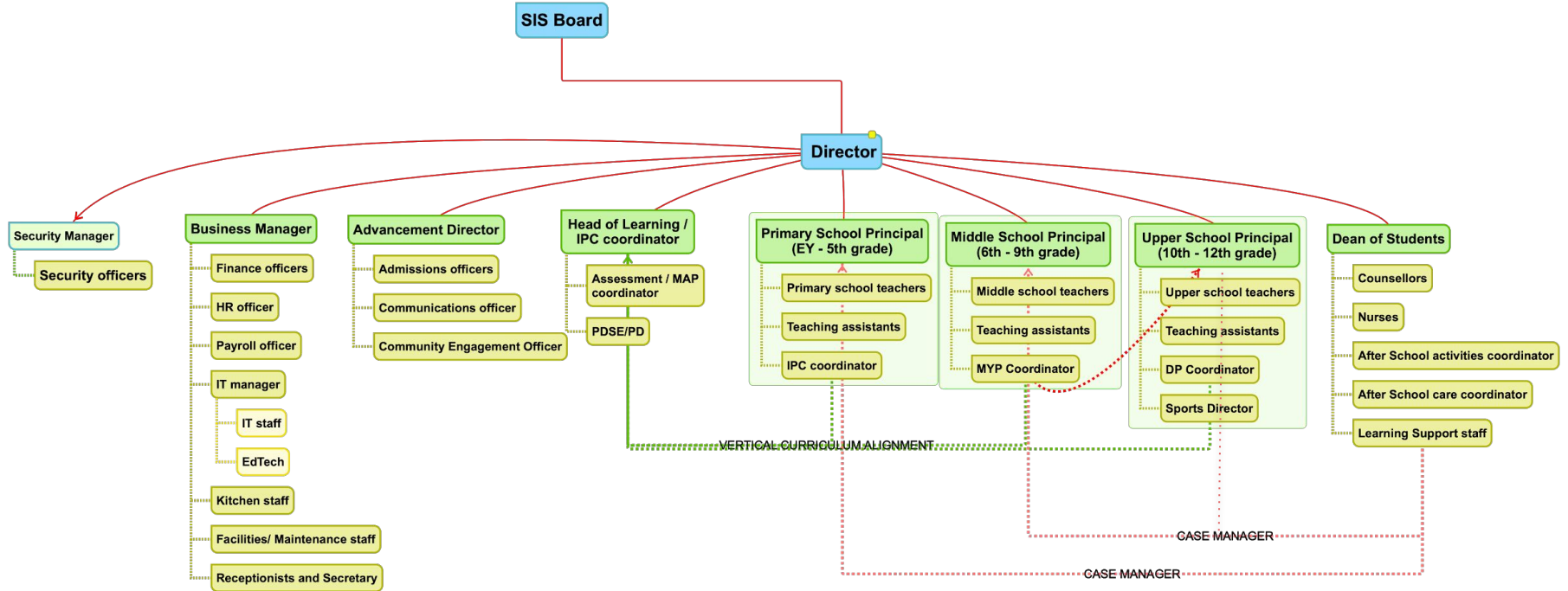

Start and finish

EY3, EY4 and Kindergarten: 8:30-**15:20**

Grade 1 to 5: 8:30-15:30

Middle School/ Upper School: 8:30 - 15:30/16:30

Brave the weather

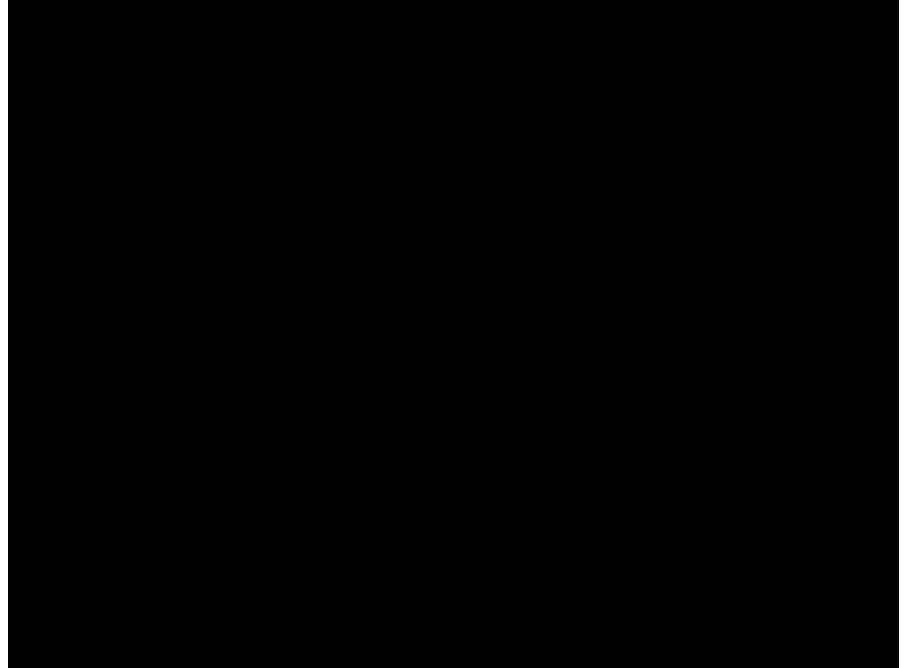


House system

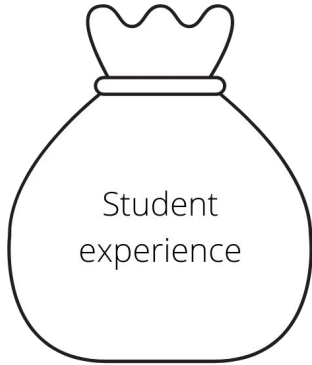

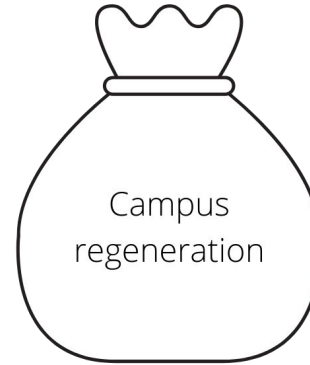

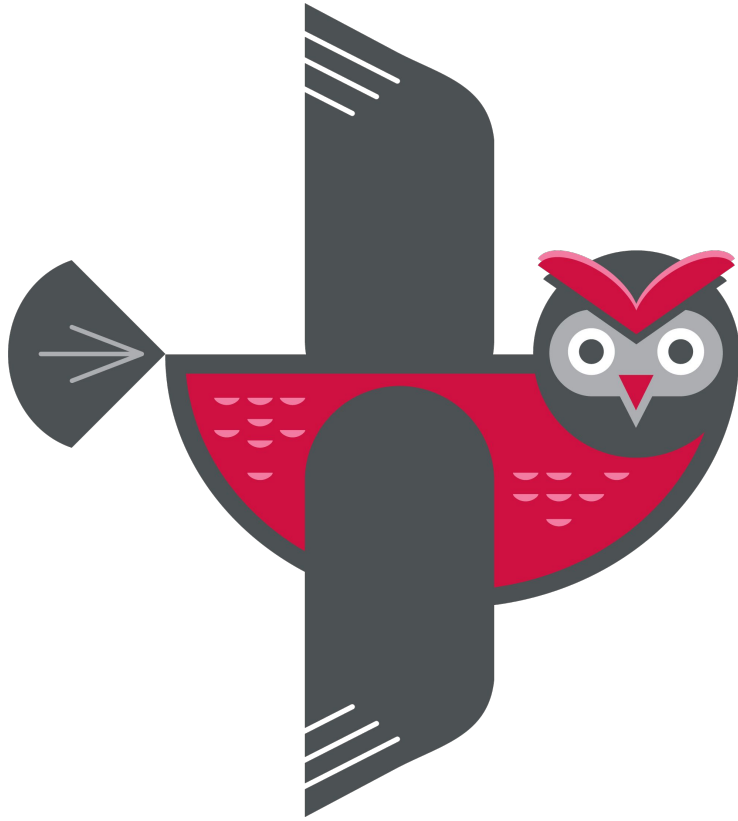
